### GIVING TO BALI'S FUTURE:

Green School, Bali's newest independent school, eagerly seeks sponsors to participate in a worthy [scholarship program](#) to support Bali's youth. The School will offer more than a dozen scholarships in its first year for local children aged two through thirteen. This will enable Bali's brightest, most creative, and most engaged students the chance to receive a world-class education for a minimal cost.



Sponsors may contribute \$8800 to select a child to support for one year. Each student will communicate regularly with his or her sponsor, providing updates from the classroom and stories about the learning environment at Green School.

Alternatively, individuals can also [contribute](#) an amount of their choice to a general scholarship pool that will assist with several students. These donors will receive updates on learning at Green School from our community.
