Real Skills, Real Solutions





Impactful Global Connections

Partnerships play a key role in our efforts to support the next generation of changemakers and allow them to make local and global impact.

Intercontinental Hotels Group, Bali

Our newly formed partnership with InterContinental Hotels Group (IHG) provides collaborative learning and solutions creation opportunities. Our students visit their Bali hotels and act as auditors. They review performance on the water, energy, waste, and other sustainability metrics and make some recommendations. They construct an official report after each audit is completed and the project is highly collaborative with opportunities for mutual learning.

Potato Head, Bali

As environmental sustainability practices become a crucial priority in the world, our partnership with Potato Head Family focuses on supporting young changemakers with access to environmental focused education. Providing them the tools, and the skills they need for their future. Four of our Balinese students are supported by Potato Head through our scholarship program. To raise awareness of environmental sustainability and promote sustainable design, together we curate free events and workshops open to the public.

Zero Mass Water, Arizona

Six solar hydro-panels installed on our campus thanks to Zero Mass Water. These panels produce water by combining sunlight and air. Water vapor is collected from the air, mineralized, and delivered into a tap - ready to drink! Zero Mass Water are on a mission to provide clean drinking water to parts of the world where accessibility is scarce. With the mission of sustainability and community in mind, Green School collaborates with Zero Mass Water and hope that our students can learn from the application of their technology, and be inspired to provide even more creative-innovative solutions to provide clean-drinking water.

Turbulent, Belgium

The journey of our votex is filled with many ups and downs. But now, we can proudly present to you our newly installed and powerful vortex! With our friends, Turbulent from Belgium, we have successfully installed the turbine technology into the lovely Ayung River. Based on initial testing, the vortex can provide up to 65-80% of Green School's electrical needs when fully operating. Additionally, our hopes are to be able to produce in excess so that we are able to distribute not only for Green School but also export to the grid. With this new vortex, Green School can strengthen its goal to be 100% renewable.










Special Thank You Note
