



Becoming an Intern at Green School

Are you a bright, generous, energetic, green-minded, education-oriented university student looking for a Bali adventure?

One of the aims of the Green School intern program is to create a space within a sustainable environment where individuals have a desire to exchange knowledge about new paradigms in education, nature, global citizenship, and how this relates to themselves as well as others. It is a central goal of our intern program to provide opportunities for learning and sharing for all members of the local and international community.

Interns gain valuable experience and learn job-related skills and the importance and impact of communication, teamwork, and working styles and personalities in different cultures. The Green School environment offers a holistic way of working and living with multi-national staff, in a safe environment with regular check-ins with participants, helping them to maintain balance in all aspects of their campus and academic lives.

The love, passion and dedication that interns contribute to Green School make it the ground-breaking place of education that it is. Each year a diverse group of interns come with their own special set of interests and skills. By sharing with the community, they are helping to imagine the possibilities of what can be and shape the future of education.

Why become an intern at Green School?

A central goal of our intern program is to provide opportunities for learning and sharing for the local and international community. As an intern, you will gain valuable work experience and learn job-related skills and the importance of and impact that communication, teamwork, working styles, and personalities from different cultures can have in any organisation. The Green School environment offers a safe platform for experiencing a holistic way of working and living within a diverse community.

If you are interested in joining Green School as an **intern**:

- You are a current student or recent graduate moving on to grad school in a college or university and can provide a Letter of Appointment and a Letter of Intent (templates supplied) from your school or university
- You are available to come to Green School for a minimum of **one semester**.
- For International interns: Provide all necessary documentation and costs for the visa process - visa expenses and **costs in home country**: USD 120 estimated to be paid at embassy in home country for visa fee
- Complete a written assessment of your internship upon completion

Intern Roles

Although interns are selected and given a specific job function, much of the work they do expands the boundaries of what is listed in the position description. Because collaboration is a core aspect at Green School, interns are expected to collaborate with the Green School staff and one another on projects and programs, thus contributing in the smooth running of the school. Some of this work is strategically defined for the interns in their job descriptions, but much of will just flow naturally.



It is expected that all candidates will:

1. Bring an intense desire to learn, expand their experience of the world, share their passions and contribute to the Green School community in creative and positive ways
2. Be self-sufficient and able to take initiative in all areas of life and work, and in a position to arrange and cover your own costs; transport, accommodation, travel/health insurance (including med-evac) and living expenses
3. Commit to either a semester or full academic year of service (Semester 1: Aug – Dec, Semester 2: Jan – June)

For International Interns:

4. Hold a passport with at least 18 months validity from your planned arrival date, and more than 6 un-stamped pages.
5. Provide the necessary documentation to process the visas to legally participate in our program:
 - Copy of passport
 - Copy of birth certificate
 - Passport photo size 4x6 cm with red background
 - Home town address
 - Your CV
 - Copy of HIV test (not more than 3 months old)
 - Police Clearance/Background Check (not more than 6 months old)
 - Original High School degree and college degree (if you hold one) and transcripts from your university, if applicable, (or 6 legalised photocopies of each document - [each one must be legalised, not photocopies of one legalised document]. For the purpose of getting your application started, please email copies to us now).
 - Letter of Intent and Letter of Appointment from your university (template supplied with your acceptance letter).

A few bits of general information on Green School's Intern program:

This program is an **unpaid** educational experience. You will need to be self-sufficient and able to take initiative in all areas of life and work, and in a position to arrange and cover your own costs including travel, living, and playing expenses. If you are selected to join our community as an intern, visa expenses will be covered by Green School with the exception of the visa application fee at the Indonesian Embassy in your home country.

In order to gain entry into Indonesia, your passport must be valid for at least 18 months from your planned arrival date, and contain more than 6 un-stamped pages. To join as an intern, you should provide all necessary documents, as outlined below, to our legal department to support your application. Please check your local embassy website for other requirements and fees for obtaining a 6 month or 1 year temporary stay permit.

Once we have received all of the above documentation, the Legal Department here at Green School will process your application and seek approval of the Department of Immigration in Jakarta. Once that has been approved, you will be sent electronically all documents necessary to make application at the Embassy nearest you for your visa.



Tips before travel:

Research and sign up for an International travel health insurance plan that includes the option of medical evacuation as well as treatment in your home country for the duration of your internship. We request that you provide a copy of your insurance card/information to the Director of Learning and Teaching for our records. There are several members of the Green School community who can assist with medical questions on this end...please make sure you have a support system in place in your country to help if you need it.

Schedule in advance and commit to being on campus from Monday – Friday, except for holidays, for the agreed time period. Take the opportunity to explore this part of the world. Time away for short periods can be arranged with the Head of Department; plan your bigger adventures either before or after your assignment, or during school holidays.

Being in an environment different from what you are used to will be exciting, though can also be stressful. Maintaining a gracious and professional attitude in the face of cultural differences, language barriers, and insects will be a challenge to embrace. You will be exposed to various discomforts of daily life; will often be hot, sweaty and dusty.

After your arrival, please prepare a working cell phone (unlocked) to use locally, arrange a local SIM card on arrival, and bring a computer with basic applications.

If you choose to ride a motorbike, invest in an excellent helmet. If you choose to drive, make sure to arrange a valid international driver's license in advance. Research the laws and customs in advance.

If there is any suspicion that you may be involved with illegal substances or activity, or anything that goes against the laws of Indonesia or customs of Bali, our agreement will be cancelled, effective immediately. You will be fully responsible for yourself during your time here.

Eligibility

As there are limited positions available for interns, we have developed a thorough selection process. Selection is based on motivation, CV/résumé, reference(s) and interests.
